Indian's parent company, Polaris, is in the news again. This time it's for expanding its Iowa works to not only include Indian motorcycles but a recently-acquired electric car company.

The *Spencer Daily Reporter* reveals: Skid loaders continued to pass by and assembly line employees continued work as Gov Terry Branstad (pictured), Lt Gov Kim Reynolds and a delegation of local leaders were taken on a tour of the 565,000-square-foot Polaris manufacturing facility in Spirit Lake.

They saw an assembly line that is continually changing.

In April 2011, the company announced its acquisition of the 110-year-old Indian motorcycle line. Indian motorcycle operations were moved from King's Mountain, NC to Spirit Lake. Six days later, Polaris officials announced plans to acquire Global Electric Motorcars, or GEMs from a wholly-owned subsidiary of Chrysler. 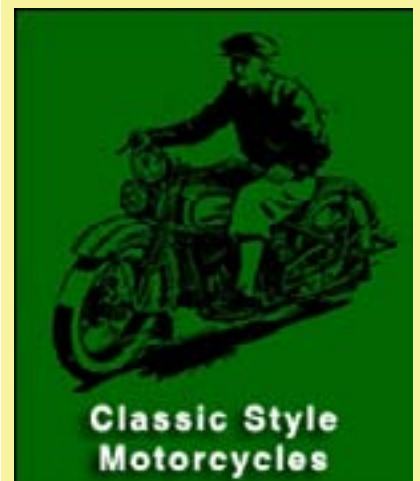
